2009 Graduation Launches Next Generation of Artists

Ninety-three dedicated and talented young artists from throughout Southern California were celebrated at the Ryman Arts graduation ceremony on Monday, June 23, 2009 at the California African American Museum in Exposition Park. The new alumni were honored for completing the school's intense training program or for their participation in the program as they graduate from high school. The evening also marked the opening reception of the museum's showcase, featuring more than 2000 f the Ryman students' best works from the 2008–2009 school year. The impressive exhibit was on view from June 16 through July 26, 2009.

This was the fifth year that the California African American Museum (CAAM) has committed to showcasing the budding talents of the Ryman Arts students. Charmaine Jefferson, Executive Director of CAAM, who joined Diane Brigham in leading the graduating ceremonies stated, "CAAM is honored to host this event to acknowledge and encourage the creative talents of this country's next generation of artists and art lovers. The entire showcase always reveals a range of skill and artistry that is well worth the visit."

Graduation was a springboard for other Rymanrelated events at CAAM, including a sketchbookmaking workshop (see page 3) and a charcoal drawing workshop taught by Ryman Arts faculty member Robin Palanker. Volunteers, including alumni, current students, parents and community members, along with alumni interns and teaching assistants were involved with the exhibition from beginning to end. They installed and took down the display, collaborated on every aspect

of graduation night, and taught the Target Sunday sketchbook-making workshop. We are grateful to Ron Antone and the team at Lexington Design & Fabrication for giving the exhibition its professional look. The graduation ceremony and the student exhibition are truly a group effort, with great results!

This year's graduates are headed to an array of distinguished institutions including Otis College of Art and Design, Art Center College of Design, Maryland Institute College of Art, Academy of Art University, California College of the Arts, School of the Art Institute of Chicago and Laguna College of Art and Design. Other destinations for Ryman's June graduates include Columbia, Scripps College, New York University, CSU Fullerton, CSU Long Beach, CSU San Diego, UCLA and USC.

New Fund Endows Class in Honor of Marty Sklar

To honor the retirement and 54-year career of Disney Legend Marty Sklar, the Ryman Arts Board of Directors announced the creation of the Sklar Legacy Fund, and The Walt Disney Company has taken the lead with a major challenge grant of \$250,000 to launch it. To receive the full grant, Ryman Arts must raise \$100,000 in contributions from individual donors. As of the end of September, we have raised over \$70,000 towards the match! (See page 4.) The \$350,000 total amount will endow an entire class of Disney Sklar Art Student Scholars at Ryman Arts. In addition, Walt Disney Parks and Resorts and The Walt Disney Studios will each host a Ryman Sklar Intern every year, selected from graduates of the program. The challenge grant was announced at Marty Sklar's retirement celebration at "Martyland" (aka the Walt Disney Imagineering patio) on July 16.

"Ryman Arts has helped thousands of teens develop their talent into careers in the arts. We are proud to support its work and especially now to honor our colleague and friend Marty." said Edward Nowak, a Disney Deputy General Counsel and Ryman Arts Board member. "We are delighted that Ryman has already almost reached the \$100,000 goal, and encourage the remaining vital \$30,000 in contributions that will trigger the company's full matching gift of \$250,000."

Marty Sklar and his wife Leah co-founded Ryman Arts in 1990, in memory of Disney artist Herbert D. Ryman, and he serves as President of the Board. Sklar began his career working for Walt Disney in 1955 writing for The Disneyland News, a themed newspaper that appeared at the park during its early days. He went on to fill numerous creative and leadership roles at Disney in the decades that followed, culminating in his senior leadership of Walt Disney Imagineering. Sklar worked closely with numerous Disney Legends, most notably Herb Ryman, who himself worked with Walt Disney on the original sketch for Disneyland Park.

"We are enormously grateful to The Walt Disney Company for making the lead challenge pledge launching the Marty Sklar Legacy Fund," said Diane Brigham, Executive Director of Ryman Arts. "This will ensure that more incredibly talented young people can pursue their artistic dreams with quality studio art instruction and internships for years to come. It's just in time, as the demand for Ryman Arts has jumped with the cuts to art programs in the schools. We salute The Walt Disney Company and know that others will want to join with them in supporting young artists in the critical early stages of their artistic journeys."

Ryman Graduate Creates Community Art
